Did You Know?

The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist celebrated on June 24 occurs close to the summer solstice in the Northern Hemisphere as a way to highlight the scripture verse "*He must increase, I must decrease*" (John:3:30) and the symbolism of the true light coming into the world. It is one of the oldest festivals of the Christian Church and anticipates the feast of Christmas celebrated six months later on December 25th. Saint Augustine proposed these dates since after the birth of John the Baptist, daylight begins to grow shorter whereas after the Jesus' birth, the number of daylight hours begins to increase.

Not Married in the Catholic Church?

For various reasons, couples choose to be civilly married but did not have a religious celebration in the Catholic Church. According to Church teaching, Catholics who marry are required to have their unions celebrated in the Catholic Church in order to participate in the church's sacramental life. As recent parent meetings for sacramental preparation have raised, this situation often poses problems for families raising children. For those who are civilly married and did not have a previous marriage celebrated in the Catholic Church requiring an annulment, the process to have the marriage validated or blessed by the Catholic Church is usually not complicated. If you find yourself in this situation, please consider making an appointment to speak with Fr. Kerrigan or Fr. Antonio to discuss what may be done.

If you are one of them or know someone who would like to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation this coming Fall, please contact Fr. Kerrigan to discuss preparation arrangements.

Some Helpful Things Which You Can Do to Help Us

- 1) Register as a parishioner. It is important for our staff to know that you are in our parish records. This is especially true when sponsor letters are needed for sacramental celebrations in other parishes or letters of referral are requested. *Remember the Holy Family went to Bethlehem and needed to register for the census.*
- 2) Please notify the parish office when you move to a new address, any changes in your personal status, or no longer desire to make use of the weekly support envelopes
- 3) Kindly schedule appointments to meet with clergy. The many time demands placed upon priests these days, like many professions, do not always allow for "drop-ins" or unscheduled meetings.
- 4) Arrive on time for our parish Masses and stay until the conclusion; those who are involved with parish liturgical ministries (Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Altar Servers) are reminded to arrive 15 minutes before Mass

These are little things that will make a big difference. Many thanks for your cooperation, understanding, and assistance in this regard.
