A Different Type of Royalty

Each year the Church ends the liturgical year with the celebration of *The Feast of Christ the King*. While many of us have various images of Jesus as the Son of God, Lord, a charismatic preacher who lived in 1st century Palestine, teacher, miracle worker, advocate for the socially marginalized, few of us probably envision Jesus as a King or royal figure.

Time and time again, Jesus reminded His followers that “*The Kingdom of God*” is radically different from earthly royalty and is not based on privilege, power, rank or birth. The Kingdom of God is a different type of society or world order primarily based on love of God, service for others, care and concern for the outcast.

In many ways the challenge for us as followers of Jesus Christ and members of the Kingdom of God is *transformation*. How do we witness to a different set of values, which are at times contrary to popular society? Are we willing to be counter-cultural? How do we bring about the message of the Kingdom of God to the present age?

Needless to say, many of us struggle with this mission. The baptismal anointing with the Sacred Chrism reminds us: “*As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet and King, so may you live always as members of His body, sharing everlasting life.*”

Perhaps a helpful way to consider this task is the concept of dual citizenship, a theme found in *The Gospel of St. Matthew* from which have been reading this past liturgical year. While we are members of secular society and reside in a particular nation, we also are members of a worldwide religious community of followers who strive to continue the saving mission of Jesus Christ as we await His return in glory.

As the Second Vatican Council and post-Conciliar documents have reminded us, *the Church exists in, not apart from, the modern world*. The complexities and challenges of the 21st century should not overwhelm or discourage us but be seen as important opportunities to advance the Kingdom of God in a crucial time in human history which still needs to hear this message. May we continue to find the good in the secular and transform the present age with our sense of the sacred. Indeed, this is a different type of royalty and dual citizenship!


nation by the pilgrims who ventured to come to the New World seeking religious freedom and a new way of life.
