

GENERAL CONDITIONS

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Transportation is in economy class on regular scheduled IATA Airline. Fare is based on GROUP/APEX as applicable for groups flying together for entire itinerary.

The city is often referred to as the "**birthplace of the Portuguese nationality**" or "**the cradle city**". Late in the afternoon we arrive in **Porto**. Dinner and overnight in **Porto. (B,D)**

DAY 05 – OCT. 27

PORTO

After breakfast we visit **Porto**, the Portugal's second largest city which is often referred to as the capital of the north. It is a bustling city renowned for being the business and commercial center for Portugal. The old town

Continue to the **Sanctuary 2 Our Lady of Ortiga**" and to the **Parish Church**. Celebrate **MASS** in one of the chapel in Fatima. The afternoon is free for visits or personal devotions. Overnight in **Fatima. (B)**

DAY 05 – OCT. 27

PORTO

It is a bustling city renowned for being the business and commercial center for Portugal. The old town, **the Ribeira**, retains its medieval feel with lots of steep, narrow, cobbled streets lined with tall brightly painted houses all topped in terracotta roof tiles. These streets all eventually wind down to the river **Douro** - once the main focal point for trade to the region. The striking bridge **Ponte de Dom Luis I** connects Porto to **Vila Nova de Gaia** across the river. The characteristic waterfront that has been featured in many a picture of Portugal, has been listed as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site**. We visit the **Sao Francisco Church**, which is the most prominent **Gothic** monument in Porto, being also noted for its outstanding **Baroque** inner decoration. It's located in the center of the city, declared **World Heritage Site by UNESCO**. Overnight in **Porto. Dinner on our own (B)**

DAY 06 – OCT. 28 COIMBRA/FATIMA

Breakfast and departure directly to **Coimbra** the "city of Students" in Portugal famous for its university (Year 722), one of the oldest of Europe. In Coimbra time to visit of **Santa-Cruz church**. From here we continue to Fatima. Religiously presented as the world

Visit of **Sintra National Palace**, also called "**da Vila**", which houses

examples of the 16th century's Manueline style and finally the Monument to the Discoveries. Return to the hotel. This afternoon we have sometime one our own to explore this fascinating city. **Farewell dinner** and overnight in **Lisbon. (B,D)**.
