Popes John XXIII and John Paul II formally became saints of the church this Sunday April 27th in a special canonization ceremony presided by Pope Francis in St. Peter's Square, Vatican City. These two shepherds of the universal church were pastoral leaders who impacted the life of the Catholic Church and greatly shaped the directions in proclaiming the light of the Gospel message for contemporary society in the spirit of the Second Vatican Council. May we invoke their intercession and follow their example as models for us to continue the Church's ongoing mission of "reading the signs of the times" and "meeting the needs of the age" in spreading the love of Jesus Christ to all we meet.

Did You Know?

John 20:19-31 is the Gospel passage read each year on the 2nd Sunday of Easter. *The Gospel of St. John* is the only one of the four Gospels to recount the story of Thomas as being absent on Easter Sunday when Jesus appeared behind the locked doors.

While this Gospel account gave rise to the popular phrase "Doubting Thomas" (Thomas doubted when told by others about the resurrected Christ), when Thomas does see the resurrected Christ the following Sunday, he states the highest Christological title found in the Gospels: "**My Lord and My God.**" (John 20:28)

HIS WORD TODAY

Second Sunday of Easter or Sunday of Divine Mercy

April 27, 2014

“Blessed be God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy gave us a new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled and unfading, kept in heaven for you who by the power of God are safeguarded by faith, to a salvation that is ready to be revealed in the final time.”

The letter of Peter, a baptismal sermon for new Christians, fits all of us today, as we live the Easter event. Our baptism provides a new birth for us all. We all celebrate birthdays, either with great anticipation or reluctantly counting the year. Because of Christ's resurrection we love Him, we believe in Him and place our hope and trust in Him.

Today is special, as the church proclaims as saints two great popes of our own time, Saint John 23rd and Saint John Paul II. Chosen to lead the church as successors of Peter and Vicar of Christ, they brought us through the second half of a tumultuous century marked by war, division.

Saint John, led by the Spirit, summoned the bishops of the world, calling for 'aggiornamento' an opening of the window of the church. The second Vatican Council, with decrees on the church, the church in the world of today, the importance of Scripture and relations with other faiths followed his great social encyclicals Mater et Magistra and Pacem in Terris. We bear the fruit of his wisdom today.

Saint John Paul, guided us through sound teaching and a personal missionary effort, visiting countless nations and touching the lives of millions by his presence and profound Teaching. It was he who designated this day as 'Divine Mercy Sunday.'

Although we have as our goal, oneness with Jesus, we are offered two special models to intercede for us, provide us with examples and incentives, and challenge us as we live our baptismal calling.

La carta de San Pedro, un sermón bautismal para nuevos cristianos, nos habla a todos nosotros hoy, al vivir los eventos de la Pascua. Nuestro bautismo nos provee un nuevo renacer a todos. Todos celebramos cumpleaños, ya sea con gran anticipación o renuientemente contando los años. Hoy es un día especial, cuando la iglesia proclama como santos a dos grandes papas de nuestro tiempo: San Juan XXIII y San Juan Pablo II. San Juan, guiado por el Espíritu, convocó a los obispos del mundo, llamando por 'aggiornamento' una abertura a la ventana de la iglesia. El Segundo Consejo Vaticano, el cual decreta sobre la iglesia, la iglesia en el mundo de hoy, la importancia de las Escrituras y las relaciones con otras religiones siguieron sus grandes encíclicas sociales Mater et Magistra y Pacem in Terris. Gozamos hoy del fruto de su sabiduría.

San Juan Pablo nos guió a través de profundas enseñanzas y esfuerzo misionero personal, visitando incontables naciones y tocando la vida de millones con su presencia y enseñanzas. Fue el quién designó este día como 'Domingo de Misericordia Divina'.
