HIS WORD TODAY

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time
January 26, 2014

“Let there be no factions; rather, be united in mind and judgment. I have been informed, my brothers, by certain member’s of Chloe’s household that you are quarrelling among yourselves. This is what I mean: One of you will say ‘I belong to Paul,’ another ‘I belong to Apollos,’ still another ‘Cephas has my allegiance,’ and the fourth ‘I belong to Christ.’ Has Christ been divided into parts?”

How appropriate Paul’s teaching as we commemorate the week of prayer for Christian unity. Paul lamented the division he observed among disciples of various schools, losing focus of the Person of Jesus. He is aware of his mission to preach the gospel, making sure the cross of Christ does not lose its meaning.

How many people we meet who tell us they are Christian. Catholics are Christians too. For over one thousand years, the body of Christ has known division, between east and west, Protestants and Catholics, and more recent movements proposing their way of life as the only way. So concerned with the movement, the Person of Christ sometimes is obscured.

When Jesus prayed His priestly prayer in the gospel of John, did He not pray that all might be one? Do we relegate that prayer to His time and place? Are not the words which came from His lips, and the desire of Paul that the cross not be void of its meaning just as important today? Religious tolerance is important and respect essential, but ‘the mission of Christ the Redeemer, entrusted to the church today is still far from completion,’ the words of Blessed John Paul II.’ May we pray with Jesus that all may be one.

SU PALABRA HOY

“Les ruego, hermanos, en nombre de Cristo Jesús, nuestro Señor, que se pongan todos de acuerdo y terminen con las divisiones; que encuentren un mismo modo de pensar y los mismos criterios. Personas de la casa de Cloe me han hablado de que hay rivalidades entre ustedes. Puedo usar esta palabra, ya que uno dice: ‘Yo soy de Pablo’, y otro: ‘Yo soy de Apolo’, o ‘Yo soy de Cefas’, o ‘Yo soy de Cristo’. ¿Quieren dividir a Cristo?”

Las palabras de las enseñanzas de San Pablo son muy apropiadas cuando conmemoramos la semana de oración por la unidad cristiana. San Pablo lamentaba la división que observó entre los discípulos de varias escuelas, perdiendo el foco de la Persona de Jesús. Se da cuenta de su misión de predicar el evangelio, asegurándose de que la cruz de Cristo no pierda su significado.

Encontramos a mucha gente que nos dice que son cristianos. Los católicos son cristianos también. Por más de mil años, el cuerpo de Cristo ha sido dividido, entre el este y el oeste, los protestantes y los católicos, y más recientemente, por movimientos que proponen su estilo de vida como el único camino. Tan involucrados están con el movimiento que la Persona de Cristo a veces se pierde.

Cuando Jesús oraba su oración sacerdotal en el evangelio de San Juan, ¿no oraba El para que todos pudieran ser uno? ¿Delegamos esa oración a su tiempo y lugar? ¿No son las palabras que salieron de sus labios, y el deseo de San Pablo de que la cruz no pierda su significado igual de importantes hoy? La tolerancia religiosa es importante y el respeto es esencial, pero la ‘misión de Cristo Redentor, encomendada a la iglesia hoy está lejos de completarse,’ las palabras del Bendito Juan Pablo II. Ojalá que oremos junto con Jesús para que todos podamos ser uno.
