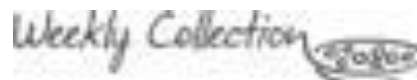

**The Epiphany of the Lord**  
**January 5, 2014**

**“I am sure you have heard of the ministry which God in his goodness gave me in your regard. God’s secret plan, as I have briefly described it, was revealed to me, unknown to men in former ages, but now revealed by the Spirit to the holy apostles and prophets.**

**It is no less than this: in Christ Jesus the Gentiles are now co-heirs...members of the same body and sharers in the promise through the preaching of the gospel.”**

While we continue to celebrate the joy of the Christmas event, it is good to pause and appreciate the significance of Christ’s becoming one with us. St. Paul, who came to know the Lord only later on the road to Damascus, tells the Ephesians (a city in Turkey today) that three things have happened.

We come to share the inheritance won by Jesus, the gift of grace and salvation. We are 1) coheirs, with special rights, privileges and obligations; 2) members of the body of Christ, which we accept as being part of the church of Jesus Christ, and 3) we are beneficiaries of the great promise given to those who accept discipleship in Christ Jesus. It is worth our while to reflect on all three.

The Christmas event is the source of great joy, as our loving Father sent us a Savior. The epiphany event shows us today, how close Christ wishes to be with us, with the threefold secret of Paul now revealed. May Epiphany deepen our appreciation of Emmanuel, God with us.

**La Epifanía del Señor**  
**5 de enero de 2014**

**“Porque seguramente habrán oído hablar de la gracia de Dios, que me ha sido dispensada en beneficio de ustedes. Fue por medio de una revelación como se me dio a conocer este misterio, tal como acabo de exponérselo en pocas palabras. Al leerlas, se darán cuenta de la comprensión que tengo del misterio de Cristo, que no fue manifestado a las generaciones pasadas, pero que ahora ha sido revelado por medio del Espíritu a sus santos apóstoles y profetas. Este misterio consiste en que también los paganos participan de una misma herencia, son miembros de un mismo Cuerpo y beneficiarios de la misma promesa en Cristo Jesús, por medio del Evangelio.”**

Mientras continuamos la celebración de la alegría de la Navidad, es importante que nos detengamos y apreciemos el significado del hecho de que Cristo se convirtiera uno con nosotros. San Pablo, quien llegó a conocer al Señor después en el camino a Damasco, les dice a los efesios (hoy una ciudad en Turquía) que tres cosas han pasado.

Venimos a compartir la herencia ganada por Jesús, el don de gracia y salvación. Somos, primero, coherederos, con derechos, privilegios y obligaciones especiales; segundo, somos miembros del cuerpo de Cristo, el cual aceptamos al ser parte de la iglesia de Jesucristo y tercero, somos beneficiarios de la gran promesa que se les hizo a aquellos que aceptan el discipulado en Jesucristo. Vale la pena que reflexionemos en las tres cosas.

El evento de Navidad es fuente de gran júbilo, ya que nuestro amoroso Padre nos envió a nuestro Salvador. La epifanía nos muestra hoy cuánto desea Cristo estar con nosotros, con el secreto de tres partes que San Pablo nos ha revelado. Que la epifanía ahonde nuestro aprecio por Emanuel, Dios con nosotros.
