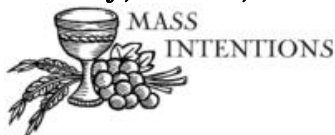

HIS WORD TODAY

**Seventh Sunday of Easter
June 1, 2014**

“After Jesus had been taken up to heaven the apostles returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day’s journey away. When they entered the city they went to the upper room where they were staying... All these devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers... ‘I pray for them...’”

The named apostles had quite an experience. They were warned of the passion, some fled the scene, the paschal mystery with the crucifixion occurred, and then they met the Risen Lord. Now what?

Obedient to the command they returned to the cenacle and were united in prayer. Once again, a time to wait. How long? In a few days, the Pentecost event and new life for all.

How beautiful we find St. Luke telling us that Mary was gathered in prayer with them. Given into John’s care at Calvary, we find our blessed Mother, who conceived by the Holy Spirit, waiting with the apostles for this promised gift. How did she feel? The loving mother. What did she know? Perhaps she reassured the apostles. The woman of silence who gave birth to the Savior, as mother of the church is waiting to give it new life.

When Jesus prayed for them in His priestly prayer, He included we who would believe. May we join too with the apostles, Mary and the entire church, asking that His Spirit may animate and motivate us as we prepare for Pentecost.

**Séptimo Domingo de Pascua
1 de junio de 2014**

“Luego de que Jesús había sido llevado a los cielos, los Apóstoles regresaron entonces del monte de los Olivos a Jerusalén: la distancia entre ambos sitios es la que está permitida recorrer en día sábado.
