Not Married in the Catholic Church?

For various reasons, couples choose to be civilly married but did not have a religious celebration in the Catholic Church. According to Church teaching, Catholics who marry are required to have their unions celebrated in the Catholic Church in order to participate in the church's sacramental life.

As recent parent meetings for sacramental preparation have raised, this situation often poses problems for families raising children. For those who are civilly married and did not have a previous marriage celebrated in the Catholic Church requiring an annulment, the process to have the marriage validated or blessed by the Catholic Church is usually not complicated. If you find yourself in this situation, please consider making an appointment to speak with Fr. Kerrigan or Fr. Antonio to discuss what may be done.

PASTORAL NOTES

Did You Know?

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called "*Laetare Sunday*" which is derived from the entrance antiphon *Laetare, Jerusalem* ("Rejoice with Jerusalem" from *Isaiah* 66:10-11).

It marks the halfway point of the Lenten season and reflects the joyful note of the ancient practice of "*handing over*" the Apostles' Creed to "*The Elect*" who are preparing for Baptism at the Easter Vigil.

In addition, it is one of two Sundays in which rose colored vestments are worn at Mass. The other Sunday is *Gaudete Sunday*, the third Sunday of Advent.

HIIS WORD TODAY

Fourth Sunday of Lent
March 30, 2014

“But the Lord said to Samuel: “Do not judge from his appearance or from his lofty stature, because I have rejected him. Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearances but the Lord looks into the heart.”... ‘Light produces every kind of goodness and justice and truth. Be correct in your judgment of what pleases the Lord.’”

As we often hear on television ‘we are at half time’. It is a good time to stop, evaluate and recap. Lent seems to be flying by and our external practices of prayer, sacrifice and good works are well under way. We look at and examine ourselves. We see where we have been and are ready to move on. As happens as the second half begins teams have to adapt and adjust. We do too when we ask what does God see being played out in these first weeks. Where is my heart?

As I direct my light do I find goodness in what I say, think and do? Am I working for justice, right relationships with others? Do I seek the truth, the Jesus who told me He is the way, truth and life? Look at the world through another lens, the one the Lord is using as you walk the days of Lent, as you begin the second half.
