The Seven Penitential Psalms

Psalm 6 *Domine, ne in furore*: Lord, do not reprove me in your anger: punish me not in your rage

Psalm 32 *Beati quorum*: Happy the man whose offense is forgiven, whose sin is remitted

Psalm 38 *Domine, ne in furore*: O Lord, do not rebuke me in your anger; do not punish me

Psalm 51 *Miserere*: Have mercy on me, God, in your kindness

Psalm 102 *Domine, exaudi*: O Lord, listen to my prayer and let my cry for help reach you

Psalm 130 *De profundis*: Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord: Lord, hear my voice!

Psalm 143 *Domine, exaudi*: Lord, listen to my prayer; turn your ear to my appeal

During Lent, it is customary to pray the seven penitential psalms. Prayerfully reciting these psalms help us to recognize our sinfulness, express our sorrow, and ask for God's forgiveness

The seven Penitential Psalms have their own special poignancy as the psalmist in each psalm pours out one's heart to God, many times in great distress over sins that have caused much physical and emotional anguish. The authors mix deep contrition with the hope that God's mercy will restore them to the joy of living in His grace. You may wish to consider reading and praying these psalms as part of your Lenten prayer.

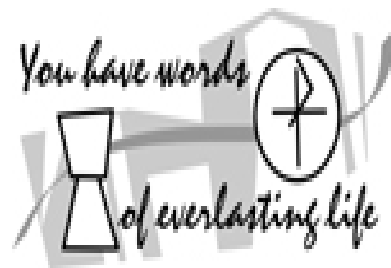

St. Paul was a fighter, taking on all adversaries, persecuting the first Christians and forming many newly found Christian communities. The focus of his work was the Person of Jesus Christ.

The sign for him was found in the cross of Jesus Christ, one whom he had never met until God's intervention on the Damascus road. The wisdom for Paul came from direct revelation received from the same Christ, the 'Jesus you are persecuting.'

Continuing my Lenten journey and reflecting on my own spiritual life I too seek signs and wisdom. I wish to know Christ Jesus in my life, deepen my relationship with Him, and know that I am one with Him.
