Making All Things New Update

The Archdiocesan Pastoral Strategic Planning Process for parishes is now at the consultative stage where the preliminary recommendations created by the Archdiocesan Advisory Group at their March Retreat for our Cluster 26 (Riverdale/Kingsbridge region) are now being reviewed and discussed by the cluster core team members of the four parishes (our parish along with Visitation Parish, St. Gabriel's Parish, and St. Margaret of Cortona Parish).

The cluster core team members will be providing feedback and reactions to the preliminary recommendations. **No actions or final decisions are being made at this time.** A response from our cluster will be sent back to the Archdiocesan Advisory Group that will meet in late June to review all Cluster responses at a second planning retreat and they will prepare their final recommendations that will be sent to Cardinal Dolan. In September, Cardinal Dolan will announce his final decisions so that the implementation process for *Making All Things New* can begin.

Your continued prayers for the Archdiocese of New York during this time of pastoral planning for the future are greatly appreciated.

and ask us to follow You.*

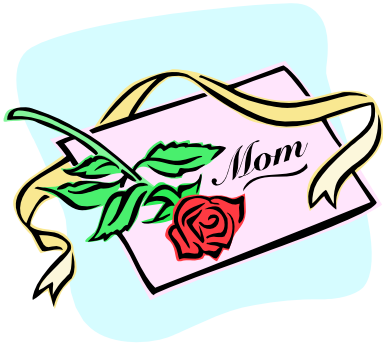
*Help us to grow in the Love

HIS WORD TODAY

What a great change has taken place. The one who denied Christ, and the others who fled, are now boldly speaking and witnessing, through the power of the Holy Spirit, what has taken place in their lives. It is worth while to read and reflect upon the 'kerygmatic' Sermons of Peter and Paul in the Acts of the Apostles. They tell us of the person of Christ, opening the door to deeper conversion, before studying His teaching and sending us on mission.

Two weeks ago, the Saint Peters of our time, Saint John Paul II and Saint John 23rd, were canonized in Rome. These two great popes whom the world knew and loved, who taught, led, witnessed and shepherded the Roman Catholic Church, are now listed in the calendar of the saints. They have called us to follow them on the road of holiness. Their example and leadership reflects the role of He who said 'I am the Good Shepherd.'

Our task today is to hear their voice, follow their example and direction, and ask their intercession as we live as members of the church. Those who heard the sermon of St. Peter dared to ask 'What are we to do, my brothers?' May we have the ability to ask what more we can and should do, and then have the Spirit direct us to respond. 'For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example that you should follow in his footsteps.'

SU PALABRA HOY

Un gran cambio se ha llevado a cabo. El que negó a Cristo, y los que huyeron están ahora valientemente hablando y dando testimonio, a través del poder del Espíritu Santo, sobre lo que ha sucedido en sus vidas. Vale la pena leer y reflexionar sobre los 'kerigmáticos' sermones de San Pedro y San Pablo en los Hechos de los Apóstoles. Nos hablan de la persona de Cristo, abriendo la puerta a una conversión más profunda, para luego estudiar Sus enseñanzas y enviarnos en nuestra misión.

Hace dos semanas, los San Pedros de la actualidad, los santos Juan Pablo II y Juan XXIII fueron canonizados en Roma. Estos dos grandes papas que el mundo conoció y amó, quienes enseñaron, guiaron, fueron testigos y pastores de la Iglesia Católica Romana, se listan en el calendario de santos. Nos han llamado a seguirlos en el camino a la santidad. Su ejemplo y liderazgo refleja el papel de El quien dijo: 'Yo soy el Buen Pastor'. Nuestra tarea hoy es escuchar su voz, seguir su ejemplo y dirección y pedir que intercedan al vivir nosotros como miembros de la iglesia. Los que escucharon el sermón de San Pedro se atrevieron a preguntar: 'Hermanos, ¿qué debemos hacer?' Ojalá que tengamos la habilidad de preguntar qué más podemos y debemos hacer, y que luego el Espíritu nos dirija a responder.

'A esto han sido llamados, porque también Cristo padeció por ustedes, y les dejó un ejemplo a fin de que sigan sus huellas.'
