The Church's Four Newest Saints

Last Sunday May 17th, Pope Francis
canonized four women from Palestine, Italy, and

France as saints in which he reminded Christians "to abide in God and in his love, and thus to proclaim by our words and our lives the resurrection of Jesus, to live in unity with one another and with charity towards all."

About the newest French saint, Sister Jeanne Émilie de Villeneuve, Pope Francis noted that "she consecrated her life to God and to the poor, the sick, the imprisoned and the exploited, becoming for them and for all a concrete sign of the Lord's merciful love."

He noted that Sister Maria Cristina Brando from Italy gave witness by remaining faithful amid obstacles that she faced. "From prayer and her intimate encounter with the risen Jesus present in the Eucharist, she received strength to endure suffering and to give herself, as bread which is broken, to many people who had wandered far from God and yet hungered for authentic love."

Regarding the two new saints from Palestine, Pope Francis noted that both exemplified another aspect of giving witness to the risen Lord by showing "unity among ourselves."

"Sister Mariam Baouardy experienced this in an outstanding way. Poor and uneducated, she was able to counsel others and provide theological explanations with extreme clarity, the fruit of her constant devotion to the Holy Spirit. Her docility to the Spirit also made her a means of encounter and fellowship with the Muslim world."

"Sister Marie Alphonsine Danil Ghattas came to understand clearly what it means to radiate the love of God in the apostolate, and to be a witness to meekness and unity. She shows us the importance of becoming responsible for one another, of living lives of service to one another."

Pope Francis concluded his homily by stating that the lives of the four saints challenge Christians to bear witness to the resurrection of Christ. To do this, the pope remarked about the importance to carry within ourselves the joy of this encounter with the risen Lord. "Let us cultivate in our hearts the commitment to abide in God's love. Let us remain united to him and among ourselves, and follow in the footsteps of these four women, models of sanctity whom the Church invites us to imitate."

Explaining Incardination

Many parishioners noted seeing and reading in the April 30th issue of *The Catholic New York* the photo of a group of ten priests who were incardinated that included me. Several inquired about what incardinated means.

Incardination is a church process in which a priest who was originally ordained for another diocese or a religious community and who desires to become a priest in another diocese or archdiocese goes through a formal process of several years to become a priest in another diocese or archdiocese. Once accepted by the bishop or archbishop, the priest becomes a member of the presbyterate in the diocese or archdiocese in which he is formally welcomed.

In my case, I was ordained a priest for the Paulist Fathers in May 1987. After prayerful reflection and vocational discernment, I requested a leave from the Paulists in August 2010 to begin the process for being considered to become a priest for the Archdiocese of New York. During that time, I served at St. Catharine of Alexandria Parish in Blauvelt and Sacred Heart Parish in Monroe until I was appointed as Administrator of St. John's Parish in November 2013.

Cardinal Dolan formally welcomed me along with nine other priests seeking to be incardinated in a private ceremony with the Auxiliary Bishops, Chancellor, Vicar General, and Director of Priest Personnel on April 14th at The Catholic Pastoral Center. I am grateful to His Eminence for welcoming my request and continue to look forward serving as a priest for the Archdiocese of New York, hopefully for many more years to come.

“In the same way, the Spirit too comes to the aid of our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes with inexpressible groaning. And the one who searches hearts knows what is the intention of the Spirit, because he intercedes for the holy ones according to God’s will.”

The Pentecost event is so well known. The signs of fire, wind and noise accompany the transforming power of the Holy Spirit. What was is no more, as the fear which brought them together was unlocked as were the doors and a new era began.

The Spirit which Jesus breathed into the apostles became the breath of new life for the church as the Spirit of God sent them to renew the face of the earth. As the doors were opened, the windows of Aggiornamento of Pope Saint John XXIII allowed new life to spring forth in the church.
