Cardinal Dolan's Making All Things New Decisions

The long awaited decision by Cardinal Dolan
in the pastoral strategic parish planning process was

announced during last Sunday's parish Masses week and specifically how it will affect our parish. Copies of Cardinal Dolan's letters that was read at Mass, both in English and Spanish, are available in the church and posted on the church bulletin boards

A few important summary points to be highlighted:

- 1) The parishes of Saint John and Visitation will merge into a new parish.
- 2) The church of Saint John will be designated as the new parish church.
- 3) It is anticipated in this time of transition and merger that by August 1, 2015, Visitation church will no longer be celebrating Masses and the sacraments on regular weekly basis.
- 4) As Cardinal Dolan stated: "This is a very difficult time for the faithful of the Parish of Visitation, as they will now worship at your parish church, and no longer at their former parish church. And so, they must see this merger not as "them" having to fit into "your" parish but as two parishes coming together, in the Lord's name, to become a new worshipping family."

During my meeting with Cardinal Dolan on October 31st when the final *Making All Things New* decisions were conveyed to the parishes, I assured him that both Fr. McCarthy, the Administrator of Visitation and I would work together with the merger of these two Kingsbridge area parishes seeing this an opportunity and important way to strengthen parish life in response to the Archdiocesan pastoral planning process. Over the coming months, a transition team will assist in implementing the merger.

Your prayers and understanding during this time of major transition in the Archdiocese of New York are greatly appreciated and much needed.

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Each year on November 9th, the universal Roman Catholic Church celebrates the anniversary of the dedication of the Cathedral Church of Rome by Pope Sylvester I on this day in 324 A.D. on land owned by the Laterani family.

The Edict of Milan in 313 A.D. promulgated by the Roman Emperor Constantine drastically changed the history of Christendom in which Christianity became the official religion of the Roman Empire and Christians could publicly worship and profess their

faith rather than be hidden or as a "underground religious movement". This *Lateran Basilica* represents this marked change in societal attitude in which Christians could assemble to worship without fear of being imprisoned, tortured or put to death.

A basilica is a church or cathedral accorded special ceremonial rights by the pope.

The Dedication of the St. John Lateran Basilica recalls the primacy of the Bishop of Rome that views this Church as "*the mother and the head of all churches of Rome and the world.*"

This Church served as the principal residence of the popes from the 4th century A.D. until being moved to Avignon in 1309 A.D. and was the site of five ecumenical councils. It was originally dedicated to Jesus the Saviour and later to St. John the Baptist.
